Gathering in the Spirit...

Call to worship (Psalm 118 with HWB 71 "Joyful, Joyful, We Adore Thee")

Leader: The Lord is my strength and my song and has given me victory. Songs of joy and victory are sung in the camp of the godly. The strong right arm of the Lord has done glorious things! I will live to tell what the Lord has done!

ALL: "Joyful, Joyful, We Adore Thee" (sing v. 1)

Or "God's faithful love endures forever!"

Leader: Open for me the gates where the righteous enter, and I will go in and thank the Lord. These gates lead to the presence of the Lord, and the godly enter there. I thank you for answering my prayer!

All: "Joyful, Joyful, We Adore Thee" (sing v. 2)

Or "God's faithful love endures forever!"

Leader: "This is the day the Lord has made. We will rejoice and be glad in it. Bless the one who comes in the name of the Lord. We bless you from the house of the Lord. You are my God, and I will praise you! Give thanks to the Lord, whose faithful love endures forever!"

All: "Joyful, Joyful, We Adore Thee" (sing vv. 3, 4)

Ritual of Response

Palm branches are often part of worship. This symbol may come from the instructions in Leviticus 23:40 for how to celebrate the Festival of Shelters: "On the first day gather branches from magnificent trees—palm fronds, boughs from leafy trees, and willows that grow by the streams" (NLT). If you have bamboo groves available, consider using them instead of palm branches. They're cheaper and symbolize how "bamboozled" the people were that day.

Confession - Response "Kyrie eleison" (HWB 144)

Leader: O God, we come to you as the people who greeted Jesus on the road to Jerusalem, full of joy and praise and thanksgiving. Forgive us for the times we forget to show you our gratitude. Lord, have mercy.

People: (singing) "Kyrie eleison"

Leader: We come as the people who were baffled when they realized how quickly their joy was turned to sorrow for you. Lord, have mercy.

People: (singing) "Kyrie eleison"

Leader: We come, wanting to be with you as you enter the time and place of your death, knowing we cannot face this week alone. Lord, have mercy.

All: (singing) "Kyrie eleison"

Assurance of pardon

Know that Jesus does offer mercy and understands that hard road between joy and devastation, between belief and disbelief. Know that Jesus will never leave you and will love you on whatever part of the road you find yourself on. Amen.

Praying for Each Other: As we enter into Holy Week and walk with Jesus to the Cross, many of our congregations will not be participating in regular Holy Week activities, such as Maundy Thursday Services, Good Friday Services, and outdoor Ways of the Cross. While online considerations are being made for Maundy Thursday and Good Friday Services, consider walking around your community and praying for your neighbourhood. Pray for those who are working long shifts at health facilities, away from their families. Pray for local businesses that have had to closer their doors. Pray for those who are lonely. Pray for children who are eager to get outside and wish to see friends and play outdoor games. And pay attention to the ways God is at work in this time, bringing us closer to God and one another.
